City of Louisiana Request for Bids (RFB) Concrete Pad Installation – Riverfront

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1. Project Overview

The City of Louisiana is seeking qualified contractors to submit bids for the installation of concrete pads at the lower level at the Riverfront, below the main parking lot area. This includes installing concrete pads on both the north and side sides of the Intake Pump Station.

2. Scope of Work

The successful vendor shall provide:

- Site Preparation
 - Excavation, grading and form to match.
 - Installation of reinforcement (rebar, mesh) as required.
 - Managing access to the lower riverfront, including equipment and material transport.
- Concrete Installation
 - South Side: Complete the final concrete pad adjacent to the existing intake structure.
 - North Side: Install concrete pad(s) to match grade and height of existing surface.



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3. Bid Requirements

Each Bid must include:

- A detailed, itemized cost estimate.
- Proposed start date and project timeline.
- Proof of insurance and applicable licenses
- References or project history related to concrete work in similar conditions

4. Submission Details

All proposals must be received by Friday, July 11, 2025, at 12 p.m. Late or electronic submissions will not be considered. Submit sealed bids via:
